<b>Discussion Notes</b>	Missing or brief notes do not provide a clear look at the purpose or conclusion of discussion.	Notes outline important questions and points raised during class discussions and draw personal conclusions.	← Plus pose questions for future follow up
<b>Writing Responses</b>	Short or missing writing responses demonstrate little thought or reflection and make little/no attempt to explore Essential Questions	Writing responses demonstrate critical thought and reflection and explore different perspectives/pose additional questions regarding the Essential Questions	← Plus draw personal connections and pose important questions for future follow up
